ORDINANCE NO. 299 OF TAHOE CITY PUBLIC UTILITY DISTRICT AMENDING AND MODIFYING ORDINANCE NO. 263 (AS AMENDED BY ORDINANCE NO. 271, 273, 279 and 281)

WHEREAS, Tahoe City Public Utility District ("District") was formed pursuant to the California Public Utility District Act and provides potable water and sewer collection service to lands within the District; and,

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of Tahoe City Public Utility District ("the Board") has authority to establish fees and charges for the provision of water to District customers. The Board establishes maximum water rates in this Ordinance for years 2020, 2021, 2022, 2023, and 2024.

WHEREAS, the Board retained HDR Engineering, Inc. (HDR) to perform a water and sewer rate study, based on the study completed by HDR in 2014. The August 2019 Comprehensive Water and Sewer Rate Study (2019 HDR Rate Study) examined the adequacy of the existing water and sewer rates, and provided the basis for adjustments to rates to adequately and equitably fund the operating and capital needs of the water and sewer system; and,

WHEREAS, the main objectives of the 2019 HDR Rate Study are to develop a projection of water and sewer revenues to support the District's operating and capital cost, proportionally allocate the costs of providing water and sewer service to those customers receiving service, and propose cost-based and equitable rates for a multi-year period; and,

WHEREAS, the 2019 HDR Rate Study included those new costs associated with the Tahoe Cedars, Madden Creek and Timberland water systems acquired by the District in 2018; and,

WHEREAS, the District prepared a 5-year water capital improvement plan, which was updated from the previous water capital improvement plan; and,

WHEREAS, the Board reviewed relevant financial data and determined that the water system rates and charges that were in effect would not generate sufficient revenue over the next five years and beyond for prudent operation of the District's water system; and,

WHEREAS, in the 2019 HDR Rate Study, HDR compared the revenue of the water utility to its expenses to determine the overall water rate adjustment required. Then, HDR allocated the revenue requirements to the various customer classes of service in an equitable manner; and,

WHEREAS, the District conducted several public meetings and workshops at which proposed water rates were discussed, public comments were received, and proposed water rates were presented along with different alternatives for their implementation over time; and,

WHEREAS, at the District Board meetings held on July 17, 2019, August 06, 2019 and August 16, 2019, the Board considered maximum water rate structure recommendations from HDR and District management and at the August 16, 2019 meeting the Board voted to change water rates effective January 1, 2020 and conduct a public hearing October 18, 2019 at 9:00 a.m., in accordance with Section 6 of Article XIIID of the California Constitution (Proposition 218); and,

WHEREAS, the District has given notice of the proposed new maximum water rates as required by law in that a notice of the public hearing of the proposed changes to the water rates was mailed to each land owner and water rate payer not less than forty-five days prior to the scheduled October 18,

2019 public hearing in compliance with Section 6 of Article XIIID of the Constitution of the State of California; and,

WHEREAS, at the District Board meeting held on October 18, 2019, the Board considered oral and written comments from the public on the proposed maximum water rates. The Board then closed the public hearing, deliberated on the water rates and structure, and directed the District Clerk to count written protests; and,

WHEREAS, following public comment, the Board adopted the 2019 HDR Final Report: Comprehensive Water and Sewer Rate Study, August 2019, as the basis for proposed maximum water and sewer rates for 2020, 2021, 2022, 2023, and 2024; and,

WHEREAS, the District Clerk advised the Board that ____ written protests out of a total of 5,715 water customers were received. It was therefore determined that a majority protest to the proposed water rates did not exist.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE TAHOE CITY PUBLIC UTILITY DISTRICT as follows:

SECTION 1: FINDINGS. After hearing and considering oral and written comments, considering the evidence offered, and duly deliberating the matters presented, the Board of Directors of Tahoe City Public Utility District finds and determines that:

- A. The above recitals are true.
- B. The Board is empowered to prescribe, revise, and collect fees and charges to operate and maintain the District's water system.
- C. The proceedings related to the proposed increase in water rates and charges have been duly noticed in compliance with the Constitution of the State of California, and other applicable law.
 - D. The water rates and charges set forth in the attached Exhibits are not discriminatory; and,
- E. The rates and charges set forth in the attached Exhibits are not excessive inasmuch as revenues from said rates and charges will not exceed the costs of providing water service.
- **SECTION 2**: WATER RATES AND CHARGES. Based upon these findings, the Board approves and directs the implementation of maximum water rates and charges for years 2020, 2021, 2022, 2023, and 2024, as set forth on Tables 3-16, 3-17 and 3-18 of the 2019 HDR Comprehensive Water and Sewer Rate Study, August, 2019, and attached as Exhibits "A-1, A-2, and B" to this Ordinance.
- A. Exhibits "A-1, A-2, and B", Water Connection Charges and Services Charges, Rate Codes 101-199 of Ordinance No. 263 (as amended by ordinance no. 271, 273, 279 and 281) are modified as shown on the Exhibits "A-1, A-2, and B" to this Ordinance 299 in order to implement revised water rates as adopted by the Board on October 18, 2019. The water rates set forth in Exhibits "A-1, A-2, and B" of Ordinance No. 299 shall take effect on January 1, 2020, unless the District revises the water rates further.
- B. Except as modified and amended hereby, Ordinance No. 263 (as amended by Ordinance No. 271, 273, 279 and 281) shall in all other respects remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 3: EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance and the amendments and modifications hereby made, shall become effective 30 days from the date of its enactment and prior thereto shall be posted and published as required by law. The water rates will be applied with the first billing period beginning on or after January 1, 2020.

SECTION 4: REVISED IMPLEMENTATION OF WATER RATE. Annually, the Board will review the operating expenses of, the capital costs of, and the revenues from the water utility received as compared to the projections used in the 2019 HDR Rate Study. The Board will then determine if the water rates for the coming year should be modified based on revised conditions in order to maintain continuity with the 2019 HDR Rate Study. The Board may reduce the water rates in any given year and cannot exceed the cumulative water rates presented for any specific year to the ratepayers through the Proposition 218 process.
